EOTAS REJECTION

This week we were disappointed to learn that a young person who has very poor mental health and unable to attend any form of education was turned down for an EOTAS package by the Local Authority.



Yet, in the same week, the same LA not only paid for a Mental Health assessment and Initial Screening, but also a whole package of care. This is utterly bizarre and makes no sense. If my recommendations are complete recovery for a young person who has been so traumatized by school, it needs to be followed through with one option – an EOTAS package. There has been a big day out in London this week to put forward a petition of signatures from parents to say that alternative

provisions (ie a selection to reflect the needs) have to be provided. If I am recommending EOTAS, I do not make this decision lightly, and will ensure I have provided as much evidence as possible to show why the care is needed. Yet, mental health seems to be regularly dismissed by some professionals within the LA. We need to keep fighting and raising awareness, which for many parents going to Tribunal to appeal.

YASMIN'S OUT OF OFFICE ADVENTURE

This week has been exceptionally busy for Yasmin, our Social Media Manager. Yasmin, as some of you might know, has been attending college over the last year, and was encouraged to apply for work experience with the BBC and Warner Brothers Studio. She got offered both, but both also wanted her to work this week. Yasmin chose to split her time between both working as a Volunteer and being paid. The BBC was working as a Volunteer and appeared to be a much smaller production set, unlike Warner Brothers Studio who had several sights over the Isle of Anglesey and Snowdonia!
